Post 911 GI Bill™ Chapter 33: General Information Specific to Hocking College

Tuition, course fees and mandatory fees are paid directly to Hocking College.

- If the Post 911 GI Bill™ has not been used, there is a total eligibility time of 36 months.

Basic Allowance for Housing (BAH) or Monthly Housing Allowance (MHA) is paid to the student on the 1st of the month for the previous month.

- A student eligible to receive 100% of their benefits receives \$1,242.00 per month for a full month. The amount is pro-rated for partial months and for less than 100% eligibility.

BAH or MHA is paid based on total tuition credits but also looks at start and end dates to determine whether a student is full-time or part-time.

- For example, a student who takes classes within an eight-week time frame would need to have 6 credit hours to be considered full time. Anything less would be paid on a pro-rated scale. For a 12 week or more semester, 12 credits are considered full-time. The VA looks at start and end dates to determine number of weeks compared to number of credit hours.

The book stipend is paid directly to the student at \$1000.00 per year.

- The student is responsible for paying Hocking College the Learning Materials Fee charged each semester. This fee is for books and materials needed for classes. This is not a mandatory fee and cannot be certified to the VA as the VA pays the student for books, not the school.

Montgomery GI Bill™ Chapter 1606 or 30: General Information

All monthly benefits allowed under the above-mentioned chapters are paid directly to the student and the student is responsible for paying Hocking College for all tuition and fees.
